Montserrat Monastery Spain

The Montserrat Monastery is also known with its formal name ‘the Santa Maria de Montserrat Monastery’. It is situated on the Montserrat Mountain, in Catalonia. Widely known Virgin of Montserrat statue is placed there in the back of the chapel. This also houses an altar made of gold.

Popa Taungkalat Shrine Burma

The Popa Taungkalat Shrine is a homeland to 37 Mahagiri Nats, or spirits. Statues representing the Nats are present at the foot of the Shrine. When you travel up the 777 steps and reach to the summit, you will need to take off socks and shoes in that holy place.

Hungry monkeys will greet you throughout the way, so please bring some food stuff to feed them and remember don’t put your belongings near to them, they can run off taking your lunch boxes!

St. Michael’s Golden-Domed Monastery Ukraine

People go to visit St. Michael’s Golden-Domed Monastery on the Dneiper River in Kiev, Ukraine. This brilliant blue monastery was initially constructed in the Middle Ages, but Soviets ruined it in 1934. Ukraine Government reconstructed it in 1999 after regaining the independence.

Rishikesh, India

Rishikesh is where the Beatles went to meet with the Maharishi in the 60’s and the lure is still there and attracting thousands who come to do yoga, meditate, and become part of the Ashram culture and Himalayan retreats.

Footsteps of Jesus, Israel

Many tour operators specialize in retracing the footsteps of Jesus Christ in Israel and take tourists to the major stops on the Jesus trail such as Jerusalem, Bethlehem, and the Church of the Nativity.

Lourdes, France

Five million pilgrims come to Lourdes every year to the site where apparitions of the Virgin Mary appeared numerous times in 1858. Unusual occurrences are said to take place all the time during mass and while drinking water from the Lourdes Spring.

Mecca, Saudi Arabia

Inside mecca sits the holiest shrine in Islam, the Kaaba, a cupoidal building inside the al-Masjid al-Haram mosque, the Sacred Mosque, where the annual Hajj revolves around. Every muslim is expected to make a pilgrimage here sometime during their life.

Varanasi, India

The Ganges River in Varanasi is considered the holiest place in the Hindu world and many have their body burned along the river banks. Ashrams and yoga schools are common throughout the northern Indian city.

Sacred Valley, Peru

This was the Inca heartland and a major tourism center that has increasingly opened its eyes toward spiritual retreats in the form of yoga sessions and workshops from world renowned leaders and ayahuasca retreats from the best shaman in the Amazon.

Stonehenge, England

This circular collection of stones eight miles north of Salisbury date back to as far as 5,000 years and attract thousands of druid wannabes and ancient societies who have traditions dating back hundreds of years if not more.

Tiger’s Nest Monastery Bhutan

Taktshang: widely famous among the monasteries in Bhutan. It is located on a 3,120-mtr cliff at a height of about 700 meters from the Paro valley. The name ‘Taktshang’ was taken from the historical tale of Padmasambhava. It is told that he had flown to the monastery riding on the back of a tiger. This monastery has seven temples. All are opened for visitors; they can either reach to the monastery by foot or on a back of a mule.

The Monastery of Gregoriou Greece

This beautiful monastery was founded in the 14th century. It is located on the southwestern part of Mount Atos. This Gregorio Monastery (dedicated to Saint Nicholas) is regarded as best among the superbly organized coenobitic monasteries. Since 1990, seventy monks are living in this monastery, though they have been dwelling there for centuries.

Yumbulagang Monastery Tibet

Yumbulagang Monastery: it’s among the earlier constructions of Tibet and also the first palace to be constructed in the country. Though, this 2,000 year old structure was completely demolished during the Cultural evolution, but later on it was reconstructed and renovated in the 1980s. The entire history of Tibet is pictured on the painted murals on the walls of the Monastery.

Madonna del Sasso Monastery Switzerland

The Monastery – Madonna del Sasso – is present high over Locarno which is on a beautiful bay in the lake. Besides having this pristine place, the region also receives maximum sunshine hours than any other place of the country. It was built to pay tribute to the honorable Virgin Mary in 1480. A huge collection of art is open for public in its museum.

Ngaphechaung Monastery Burma

Originally built in the 1850s, this wooden Ngaphechaung Monastery is constructed on stilts and present in Inle Lake. Today this monastery inhabits number of Buddhas and cats that are well prepared to jump through hoops. Visitors can reach the spot by taking a 25-min boat ride.

Gradac Monastery Serbia

Constructed in 13th century, The Gradac Monastery is located 20-km north of Raska. The church shows slight Gothic touch, however most of its design is based on the autochthonous Raska school pattern.

Meteora Monastery Greece

The Meteora Monastery has got this title for its construction. It is constructed on natural sandstone rock pillars. Meteora is a Greek word meaning suspended in the air or suspended rocks or in the heavens above. This unique monastery is the largest one in Greece. It is also among the most popular monasteries of the country. It contains 6 monasteries as well as included in the UNESCO World Heritage List.
